2. 24 writers honoured with Sahitya Akademi Award for 2023

- ◆ Twenty-four writers have received the Sahitya Akademi Award for 2023.
- ◆ The award ceremony coincided with the 70th anniversary celebrations of the National Academy of Letters at the Sahityotsav.
- ◆ The awards were given for literary works including nine books of poetry, six novels, five of short stories, three essays, and one literary study.
- ◆ Sanjeev for his novel "Mujhe Pehchaano" and Gaur for her book "Requiem in Raga Janki" received the prestigious award.
- ◆ Sadiqua Nawab Saher received the award for her book "Rajdev Ki Amrai" in Urdu, while Swarnjit Savi was awarded for his book of poetry "Mann Di Chip" in Punjabi.
- ◆ Other recipients of the awards in poetry include Vijay Verma (Dogri), Vinod Joshi (Gujarati), Manshoor Banihali (Kashmiri), Sorokkhaibam Gambhini (Manipuri), Ashutosh Parida (Odia), Gaje Singh Rajpurohit (Rajasthani), Arun Ranjan Mishra (Sanskrit) and Vinod Asudani (Sindhi).
- ◆ Apart from Gaur, Sanjeev and Saher, writers such as Swapnamay Chakrabarti (Bengali), Krushnat Khot (Marathi), and Rajasekaran Devibharathi (Tamil) have been awarded for their novels.
- ◆ For short stories, Pranavjyoti Deka (Assamese), Nandeswar Daiman (Bodo), Prakash S Parienkar (Konkani), Taraceen Baskey (Turia Chand Baskey) (Santali) and T Patanjali Sastry (Telugu) got the award.
- ◆ Lakshmisha Tolpadi (Kannada), Basukinath Jha (Maithili) and Judhabir Rana (Nepali) received the prize for their essays, while EV Ramakrishnan was awarded for his literary study in Malayalam.

3. Madhumita's book shortlisted for Women's Prize for Non-fiction

- ◆ Indian-British journalist and commentator Madhumita Murgia's book which explores the impact of AI on human society has been shortlisted for the 2024 inaugural Women's Prize for Non-Fiction.
- ◆ The six books in the shortlist are Murgia's "Code Dependent: Living in the Shadow of AI", "Thunderclap: A Memoir of Art and Life and Sudden Death" by Laura Cumming, "Doppelganger: A Trip Into the Mirror World" by Naomi Klein, "A Flat Place" by Noreen Masud, "All That She Carried: The Journey of Ashley's Sack, a Black Family Keepsake" by Tiya Miles, and "How to Say Babylon: A Jamaican Memoir" by Safiya Sinclair.
- ◆ The six books cover a broad range of subjects – from life writing, religion, art and history, to AI, social media and online politics.
- ◆ "Code-Dependent", published by Picador, explores the impact of AI – powerful, flawed, and often exploitative – on human society and exposes how it can strip away our individual and collective sense of agency.

- ◆ The top 10 cities with billionaires include, New York, London, Mumbai, Beijing, Shanghai, Shenzhen, Hong Kong, Moscow, New Delhi, and San Francisco.
- ◆ The top 10 nations with billionaires include, China, the US, India, the UK, Germany, Switzerland, Russia, Italy, France and Brazil.

1. India's GDP growth at 8.4% in Q3 2023-24

- ♦ India's gross domestic product (GDP) for the third quarter of the ongoing financial year accelerated to 8.4 per cent year-on-year, showed data shared by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation.
- ♦ In the same period last year, the GDP growth was 4.3 per cent.
- ♦ GDP at constant (2011-12) prices in Q3 of 2023-24 is estimated at Rs 43.72 lakh crore, against Rs 40.35 lakh crore in Q3 of 2022-23, showing a growth rate of 8.4 per cent.
- ♦ While analysts had estimated the GDP growth in the third quarter at below 7 per cent.
- ♦ The double-digit growth rate of the construction sector (10.7 per cent), followed by a good growth rate of the manufacturing sector (8.5 per cent) has boosted the GDP growth in FY24, according to the government.

2. Moody's raises India's 2024 GDP forecast to 6.8%

- ♦ Global rating agency Moody's has raised India's GDP growth projection for 2024 to 6.8 per cent from the 6.1 per cent.
- ♦ The increase in estimate was attributed to India's robust economic performance in 2023 and diminishing global economic challenges.
- ♦ Surpassing the analysts' expectations of 6.6 per cent, India's economy grew 8.4 per cent during the October-December quarter.
- ♦ Moody's attributed this strong growth to the government's capital spending and vigorous manufacturing activity.
- ♦ For 2025, the GDP growth is estimated at 6.4 per cent.

3. CRISIL raises India's GDP growth forecast to 6.8% for FY25

- ♦ Rating agency CRISIL raised its economic growth forecast for India in the next financial year (FY25) to 6.8 per cent from 6.4 per cent estimated earlier, citing higher growth momentum.
- ♦ In its India Outlook report, growth will moderate in FY25 from 7.6 per cent in the current financial year as higher interest rates and lower fiscal impulse will temper demand.
- ♦ The report also expects the Indian economy to grow at an average rate of 6.7 per cent till the end of this decade.
- ♦ On the inflation front, the rating agency expects the softening to continue in the next financial year on the back of healthier agriculture output that tames food inflation, and benign oil and commodity prices.

4. Moody's ups growth forecast to 8% for FY24

- ♦ Moody's Ratings has raised India's GDP growth forecast for FY24 to around 8 per cent from 6.6 per cent on the back of strong domestic consumption and capital expenditure.
- ♦ The latest estimate of Moody's is about 140 basis points higher than the earlier projection of 6.6 per cent made in November 2023.
- ♦ The National Statistical Office (NSO) has projected 8.4 per cent growth in December quarter of the current financial year.

- ♦ It has also revised GDP estimates for the first and second quarters to 8.2 per cent and 8.1 per cent from 7.8 per cent and 7.6 per cent, respectively.
5. **S&P Global raises India's FY25 GDP growth forecast to 6.8%**
- ♦ S&P Global has raised India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth forecast for Financial Year 2024-25 (FY25) by 40 basis points to 6.8 per cent or lower than the central bank and government's projection of 7 per cent.
 - ♦ The Indian economy is estimated to have clocked a growth of 7.6% in the current fiscal.
 - ♦ In November, last year, the U.S.-based agency had projected India's growth to be 6.4% in 2024-25 fiscal on robust domestic momentum.

Chapter 12: Current Affairs (National)

1. **Leopard numbers show 8% rise from 2018 to 2022**
- ♦ India's leopard numbers rose by 8% from 12,852 in 2018 to 13,874 in 2022, according to a report made public by the Environment Ministry.
 - ♦ While the highest number of leopards were reported in Madhya Pradesh (3,907), only three other States reported over 1,000 animals each — Maharashtra (1,985), Karnataka (1,879) and Tamil Nadu (1,070).
 - ♦ While Uttarakhand reported a 22% decline in the big cat numbers — reportedly due to poaching and man-animal conflict, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam and West Bengal saw a collective 150% rise to 349 animals.
2. **FSSAI gives 'Eat Right Station' certificate to 150 Railway Stations**
- ♦ Food regulator FSSAI has awarded 'Eat Right Station' certification to 150 railway stations so far for ensuring safe, hygienic and nutritious food options for passengers.
 - ♦ The 'Eat Right Station' certification process involves rigorous audits of food vendors, training of food handlers, adherence to strict hygiene and sanitation protocols and efforts to raise awareness among individuals to make informed food choices.
 - ♦ Some of the prominent stations that have been certified as Eat Right stations are in New Delhi, Varanasi, Kolkata, Ujjain, Ayodhya Cantt, Hyderabad, Chandigarh, Kozhikode, Guwahati, Visakhapatnam, Bhubaneswar, Vadodara, Mysuru City, Bhopal, Igatpuri, and Chennai, among others from various states.
3. **4 days long 'Tawi Festival' begins in Jammu**
- ♦ The four day long 'Tawi Festival' begins in Jammu region.
 - ♦ This time four-day 'Tawi festival' will strictly remain focussed on the promotion of Jammu's rich, diverse art forms and cultural heritage where the youth will also get a platform to give a vent to their creativities besides sharing thoughts with experts.
 - ♦ The festival comprises Seminars, workshops, and talks, performances of folk music and street theatre, classical and folk dance and music, and a Mela, with an emphasis on showcasing

entrepreneurship, innovation, local cuisines, and organic products sourced from women's NGO groups across the Himalayan region.

4. Ministry of Women and Child Development organizes 'Poshan Utsav'

- ♦ The Ministry of Women and Child Development has organized the Poshan Utsav at The Oberoi.
- ♦ The event aimed to promote good nutrition behavior and highlighted India's ongoing efforts to combat malnutrition by promoting good nutrition practices.
- ♦ The event was graced by the Union Minister for Women and Child Development and Minority Affairs, Smriti Zubin Irani and Bill Gates, Co-Chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF).
- ♦ The event featured the release of the 'Poshan Utsav Book', conceptualized by the Ministry of Women and Child Development and curated by the Deendayal Research Institute (DRI).

5. PM Modi launches development projects worth 35,700 crore rupees in Jharkhand

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for multiple development projects worth 35,700 crore rupees in Jharkhand from Sindri in Dhanbad district.
- ♦ These projects are related to fertilizer, rail, power, and coal sectors.
- ♦ Modi dedicated to the nation the Hindustan Urvarak & Rasayan Ltd's (HURL) Sindri fertiliser plant, in order to attain self-sufficiency in the urea sector. The plant has been developed at a cost of over 8,900 crore rupees.

6. Cabinet approves establishment of International Big Cat Alliance

- ♦ The Union Cabinet has approved the establishment of International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA) with headquarters in India with a one-time budgetary support of Rs. 150 crore for a period of five years from 2023-24 to 2027-28.
- ♦ PM Modi on the occasion of Global Tiger Day 2019 called for an Alliance of Global Leaders to curb poaching in Asia.
- ♦ While commemorating 50 years of India's Project Tiger on April 9, 2023, he formally announced the launch of International Big Cat Alliance.
- ♦ International Big Cat Alliance aiming at securing the future of big cats and landscapes they thrive. India is home to five big cats namely Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Snow Leopard and Cheetah.

7. Cabinet approves PM-Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana

- ♦ The Union Cabinet has approved a ₹75,021-crore package for the "PM-Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana" (PM Free Electricity scheme) to promote rooftop solar (RTS) installations in India.
- ♦ The scheme claims to be able to provide 300 units of "free electricity" every month to one crore households.
- ♦ Prime Minister had launched the scheme on February 13, 2024.
- ♦ Scheme provides a central financial assistance of 30,000 subsidy for 1 kW system, 60,000 for 2 kW systems and 78,000 for 3 kW systems or higher.
- ♦ Households can access collateral-free low-interest loan products of around 7 percent at present for installation.
- ♦ In addition to this, Model Solar Village will be developed in each district to act as role

model for adoption of rooftop solar in rural areas.

8. Amit Shah inaugurates National Urban Cooperative Finance and Development Corporation

- ♦ Cooperation Minister Amit Shah has launched the National Urban Co-operative Finance and Development Corporation Limited (NUCFDC), the Umbrella organization for the Urban Cooperative Banks in New Delhi.
- ♦ NUCFDC has received a Certificate of Registration from the RBI to operate as a Non-Banking Finance Company and serve as the umbrella organisation for the urban cooperative banking sector.
- ♦ The main objective of NUCFDC should be to help urban cooperative banks adhere to the Banking Regulations Act and bring professionalism in their work.
- ♦ There are more than 1,500 UCBs with 11,000 branches, having a deposit of ₹5 lakh crore and credit base of ₹3.50 lakh crore across the country.

9. L&T commissions India's first indigenously built green hydrogen electrolyser in Gujarat

- ♦ Larsen & Toubro (L&T) has commissioned its first indigenously-manufactured electrolyser at the Green Hydrogen Plant at A M Naik Heavy Engineering Complex in Hazira, Gujarat.
- ♦ This step marks L&T Electrolysers Limited's entrance into the domestic manufacturing of electrolysers, aligning with the company's focus on enhancing sustainable energy solutions.

10. Sarbananda Sonowal dedicates first-ever Made-in-India ASTDS tug

- ♦ Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal has inaugurated the 60T bollard pull tug named 'Ocean Grace' and the Medical Mobile Unit (MMU).
- ♦ The Ocean Grace is the first make in India ASTDS Tug developed by the Cochin Shipyard Limited under MoPSW.
- ♦ The 'Ocean Grace' built at a cost of Rs. 45 crores, stands as a pinnacle of maritime engineering, equipped with cutting-edge technology and boasting a remarkable bollard pull of 60 tonnes.
- ♦ The goal of the Green Tug Transition Programme (GTTP) is to convert at least 50% of all tugs into Green Tugs by 2030 and to have Green Tugs operating at all major ports.

11. Chapchar Kut Festival Celebrated Across Mizoram

- ♦ Chapchar Kut - the biggest festival of Mizoram was celebrated across the state with full traditional fervor and festivities.
- ♦ The festival has attracted thousands of people who thronged the Assam Rifles Ground - Lammual in the heart of Aizawl city with full capacity.
- ♦ Chapchar Kut, the biggest festival of the Mizos, celebrates unity and resilience after the completion of the Jhum operation.

12. Jyotiraditya Scindia inaugurates country's 1st Green Hydrogen Plant in Stainless Steel Sector at Haryana

- ♦ Union Steel Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia has virtually inaugurated India's 1st Green Hydrogen Plant in the Stainless-Steel Sector at Jindal Stainless Limited, Hisar.
- ♦ This plant will be the world's first off-grid Green Hydrogen plant for the stainless-steel industry and

the world's first Green Hydrogen plant with rooftop and floating solar.

- ♦ This project will reduce carbon emissions by around two thousand 700 Metric Tonnes per annum and 54 thousand tons of carbon dioxide emissions over the next two decades.

13. India's first indigenous Prototype Fast Breeder Reactor at Kalpakkam

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated India's first indigenous Prototype Fast Breeder Reactor (PFBR) (500 MWe) at Kalpakkam, Tamil Nadu.
- ♦ In line with the true spirit of Aatmanirbhar Bharat, PFBR has been fully designed and constructed indigenously by BHAVINI with significant contribution from more than 200 Indian industries including MSMEs.
- ♦ Once commissioned, India will only be the second country after Russia to have a commercial operating Fast Breeder Reactor.
- ♦ The PFBR reactor core consists of control sub-assemblies, blanket sub-assemblies and fuel sub-assemblies. With minimised nuclear waste generated from the reactor and advanced safety features, FBRs will provide a safe, efficient and clean source of energy and contribute to the goal of net zero.
- ♦ In India's three stages of the nuclear power programme, BHAVINI paves the way as a forerunner in the second stage by building a 500 MWe PFBR.

14. Cuttack Rupa Tarakasi, Banglar muslin get GI tag

- ♦ The Cuttack Rupa Tarakasi, more widely known as Silver Filigree, has recently been awarded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag by the Geographical Indications Registry in Chennai.
- ♦ This recognition, sought by the Odisha State Co-operative Handicrafts Corporation Limited and supported by the Department of Textile and Handicrafts, Government of Odisha, places Cuttack's Silver Filigree on the map as a unique and protected form of art.
- ♦ Silver Filigree, or Tarakasi, is a testament to the unparalleled skill and precision of artisans in Cuttack.
- ♦ The craft's history traces back to over 500 years ago, with influences spanning from Persia to Indonesia, and finally making its home in Cuttack, Odisha.
- ♦ This intricate form of metalwork involves twisting thin silver wires to create delicate and complex designs, often used in jewelry and decorative items.

15. Mandaviya inaugurates Three CIPET Centers Across India

- ♦ Union Minister of Chemicals and Fertilisers and Health and Family Welfare Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya virtually inaugurated 3 centers of Central Institute of Petrochemicals Engineering & Technology (CIPET) established across India.
- ♦ These three new CIPET centres dedicated to the nation by the Minister are CSTS Baddi (Himachal Pradesh), CSTS, Ranchi (Jharkhand), and CSTS Gwalior (MP).
- ♦ CIPET Institutes helped the industry not only by providing skilled manpower but also by research and production. By getting training from CIPET, youth almost get 100% jobs in petrochemical sector.
- ♦ CIPET was started in 1968 in Chennai as Central Plastic Engineering and Tool Institution.

16. India's unemployment rate in 2023 dropped to 3.1%: NSO

- ♦ India's unemployment rate dropped to 3.1 per cent in 2023 from 3.6 per cent in the preceding year, reflecting continued improvement in the labour markets, revealed the latest employment-unemployment indicators report released by the National Statistical Office.
- ♦ During the calendar year 2023, the unemployment rate in both rural and urban areas declined to 2.4 per cent and 5.2 per cent, respectively, from 2.8 per cent and 5.9 per cent in 2022.
- ♦ The unemployment rate for rural women (1.9 per cent) was lower than for rural men (2.7 per cent) in 2023, whereas in urban areas, the rate was higher for women (7.5%) compared to men (4.4%).

17. BHEL bags order worth Rs 9,500 cr to set up 1,600 MW thermal project

- ♦ Power equipment major Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) has secured a power plant engineering, procurement, and construction (EPC) order of over Rs9,500 crore from NTPC Ltd.
- ♦ The order is for the Singrauli Super Thermal Power Project Stage-III (2x800MW), in Uttar Pradesh.
- ♦ According to BHEL, the order won in international competitive bidding is for the supply of equipment like boilers, turbines, generators, and associated auxiliaries, along with electrical and control and instrumentation, balance of plant packages, and others.

18. PM Modi inaugurates India's first underwater metro in Kolkata

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated India's first under-river metro tunnel in Kolkata.
- ♦ The metro tunnel has been built under Kolkata's Hooghly River that will connect Howrah Maidan to Esplanade.
- ♦ The 4.8 km stretch between Howrah Maidan and Esplanade is the second section of the East-West Metro corridor between Howrah Maidan and the IT hub Salt Lake Sector V.

19. Government launched innovative NITI for states platform for policy and good governance

- ♦ Minister of Communications, Railways, and Electronics & Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw has launched NITI Aayog's NITI For States platform at Rang Bhawan Auditorium, Akashvani, New Delhi.
- ♦ The 'NITI For States', is a cross-sectoral knowledge platform designed to become a Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) for Policy and Good Governance.
- ♦ The significant features of the platform include a multi-sectoral live repository of 7,500 Best Practices, 5,000 Policy documents, 900+ datasets, 1,400 data profiles, and 350 NITI publications.

20. Rajnath Singh inaugurates 'Chola' building at Naval War College

- ♦ Raksha Mantri Rajnath Singh has inaugurated the new Administrative & Training building at the Naval War College (NWC) in Goa.
- ♦ The modern edifice, named the 'Chola', pays homage to the mighty maritime empire of the Chola dynasty of ancient India.

21. Fly91 gets DGCA approval to start flights

- ♦ The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has granted air operator's certificate to Goa-based Just Udo Aviation Pvt Ltd to operate its airline Fly91.
- ♦ The grant of the air operator certificate marks the completion of all regulatory and compliance

requirements for the airline to begin its commercial operations.

- ♦ The airline has been allocated its first set of routes under the government's regional connectivity scheme UDAN, or Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik.
- ♦ This includes routes to Sindhudurg, Jalgaon, Nanded and Agatti from Bangalore, Goa, Hyderabad and Pune under the UDAN 5.0 of the civil aviation ministry.

22. Kerala Launches India's First Govt-Backed OTT Platform, 'CSpace'

- ♦ Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan has inaugurated the state's own Over-The-Top (OTT) platform at Kairali Theatre.
- ♦ The platform, called CSpace, is India's first government-backed OTT platform.
- ♦ The OTT platform is managed by Kerala State Film Development Corporation (KSFD), a state-owned entity entrusted with the promotion of Malayalam cinema.
- ♦ A special curator panel is set by KSFD to select content for the platform.

23. IOC to make fuel for Formula 1 - first by an Indian firm

- ♦ India's largest oil company, Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOC) will start manufacturing fuel used in adrenaline-pumping Formula One or F1, motor racing as it looks to expand its basket of niche fuels.
- ♦ F1 fuel is essentially high-octane petrol and the standards are heavily regulated by global motor sport governing body Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) on various counts, including permissible additives and blending agents.
- ♦ IOC will supply fuel for all the motorcyclists from 15 countries that will participate in the FIM Asia Road Racing Championship.

24. First Bharat Steam Boiler Expo 2024 held in Guwahati

- ♦ The first Bharat Steam Boiler Expo 2024 was held at Veterinary College Field in Guwahati, Assam.
- ♦ The expo is organized by the Assam's Inspectorate of Boilers (CIB) and supported by the Assam government's Labour Welfare Department.
- ♦ The expo aims to improve the efficiency and growth of various sectors that use steam boilers.

25. Govt extends subsidy for Ujjwala beneficiaries by another one year

- ♦ The Union Cabinet has decided to extend the subsidy of ₹300 per LPG cylinder for up to 12 refills per year till the end of next financial year (March 2025).
- ♦ About 10.27 crore beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) will get the benefit of the scheme with its continuation set to incur ₹12,000 crore.
- ♦ The Centre had started a targeted subsidy of ₹200 per cylinder for up to 12 refills per annum to the PMUY consumers in May 2022.
- ♦ In October 2023, the Centre increased the subsidy to ₹300 per cylinder for up to 12 refills per year.
- ♦ As on February 1, 2024, the effective price of domestic LPG for PMUY consumers is ₹603 per LPG cylinder of 14.2 kg.

26. World's largest literary festival-'Sahityotsav' to be held from March 11-16

- ♦ World's largest literary festival-'Sahityotsav' by Sahitya Akademi will be held from the 11th to 16th of March.

- ♦ The festival commemorating 70 years of Sahitya Akademi will witness the participation of more than a hundred renowned writers and scholars.
- ♦ Over 190 sessions and more than 175 languages of the country will also be represented during the festival.
- ♦ The Chief Guest of the Awards Presentation Ceremony will be Pratibha Rai, the distinguished Odia writer.

27. Cabinet approves 4% hike in DA for government employees

- ♦ The Union Cabinet has approved hike in dearness allowance (DA) for central government employees and dearness relief (DR) for pensioners by 4 per cent with effect from January 1.
- ♦ With this revision, the DA will reach 50 per cent. This means various other allowances such as Housing Rent Allowances (HRA), Children's Education and Transport Allowances, and gratuities, will also go up based on the formula suggested by the 7th Pay Commission.
- ♦ All of them will get arrears for January and February and the revised rate for the current month, along with salary and pension for March.

28. PM launches 52 tourism sector projects worth more than Rs 1400 crores

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched 52 tourism sector projects worth over Rs 1400 crore under the Swadesh Darshan and Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual Heritage Augmentation Drive (PRASHAD) schemes.
- ♦ Nine tourism infrastructure projects, spread across the country, developed under Swadesh Darshan and PRASHAD schemes worth Rs 469 crore were launched, besides 43 other projects worth Rs 963 crore were also launched under the two schemes of tourism ministry.
- ♦ The project launch events were also carried out at all the 52 destinations, simultaneously by the ministry, state government, UT administrations and local authorities.
- ♦ The projects launched included three projects under PRASHAD Scheme (Hazratbal- Srinagar, Jogulamba- Telangana, Amarkantak-Madhya Pradesh) worth Rs 129.35 crore.

29. Cabinet approves MSP for Raw Jute for 2024-25 Season

- ♦ The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has increased the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for raw jute for the 2024-25 season by ₹285 to ₹5,335 per quintal.
- ♦ The decision would ensure a return of 64.8% over the all-India weighted average cost of production.
- ♦ In the last 10 years, the government has increased MSP for raw jute from ₹2,400 per quintal in 2014-15 to ₹5,335 a quintal in 2024-25, registering a growth of 122%.
- ♦ The decision is expected to help jute farmers in West Bengal, Bihar and Assam.

30. PM Modi dedicated Sela tunnel to nation

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has dedicated the Sela tunnel in Arunachal Pradesh to the country, with the new route allowing faster deployment of weapons, soldiers and equipment to forward areas near the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the Tawang sector.
- ♦ the tunnel is built by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) at a cost of Rs 825 crore. It is the world's longest twin-lane tunnel above 13,000 feet.

- ♦ The tunnel will cut down the travel time to Tawang by at least one hour as well as provide all-weather connectivity.

31. Bichom becomes 27th district of Arunachal Pradesh

- ♦ Bichom, carved out of West and East Kameng, became the 27th district of Arunachal Pradesh.
- ♦ In February this year, the state assembly passed the Arunachal Pradesh (Re-Organization of Districts) (Amendment) Bill, 2024 for the creation of Bichom and Keyi Panyor districts.
- ♦ A total of 27 villages from West Kameng and 28 from East Kameng were made part of Bichom district.

32. DST, T-Hub launch AI-ML hub in Hyderabad

- ♦ The Department of Science and Technology (DST), which works under the Union Ministry of Science and Technology, and start-up ecosystem enabler T-Hub have joined hands to set up a Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence Technology Hub (MATH) in Hyderabad.
- ♦ The hub will work to foster AI innovation, create job opportunities, and provide a conducive ecosystem for AI and ML start-ups.

33. India to construct a 10,000-GPU Supercomputer for self-sufficient AI advancement

- ♦ The Indian government, led by PM Narendra Modi, has approved a new \$1.24 billion investment for the India AI mission, a "national-level" plan designed to create an all-Indian AI ecosystem from scratch.
- ♦ This initiative aims to create an all-Indian AI ecosystem from scratch, bolstering India's technological prowess and fostering innovation in AI.
- ♦ The HPC system, expected to include 10,000 "or more" GPUs as AI accelerators, will be developed through a public-private partnership to support startups and research organizations.

34. PM Modi lays foundation stone of "Experience of Spirituality at Chitrakoot Ghat" project in Chitrakoot

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi performed Bhoomi Pujan and inaugurated projects worth 118 crore 72 lakh rupees in Madhya Pradesh through videoconferencing.
- ♦ These include various projects in Gwalior and Chitrakoot under Swadesh Darshan 2.0 scheme and development work of Amarkantak and Pitambara Peeth Temple Datt under Prasad scheme.
- ♦ PM also laid the foundation stone of the "Experience of Spirituality at Chitrakoot Ghat" project in Chitrakoot.
- ♦ The Prime Minister also inaugurated various development works worth 50 crore rupees under the Prasad Scheme in Amarkantak. Which includes development around Narmada Temple, and expansion of tourist and public facilities in Amarkantak.

- ♦ This 15-day celebration aims to spread awareness about nutrition, dietary practices, and women's health.

- ♦ The ONGC Para Games is a testament to the spirit of the participating athletes.
- ♦ The 5th ONGC Para Games, featuring a total of 371 athletes will witness active participation across a range of sporting disciplines.
- ♦ Athletes from various oil and gas public enterprises will compete across disciplines such as athletics, badminton, table tennis, and wheelchair racing.

38. PM Modi unveils 125-foot tall statue of Lachit Borphukan

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has unveiled a 125-foot bronze statue of 'Ahom general' Lachit Borphukan in Assam's Jorhat.
- ♦ The 'Statue of Valour' was unveiled by the PM at the Lachit Barphukan Maidam Development Project at Hollongapar near Teok.
- ♦ The height of the statue, built by Ram Vanji Sutar, is 84 feet and it is set on a pedestal of 41 feet, making the structure 125 feet tall.

➤ About Ahom General Lachit Barphukan

- ♦ Ahom General Lachit Barphukan was one of the five Barphukans who held administrative, judicial, and military duties in the Ahom kingdom of Assam and was born in 1622.

39. India now stands as the world's second-largest producer of mobile phones

- ♦ India now stands as the world's second-largest producer of mobile phones at the end of the decade 2014-2024.
- ♦ India Cellular and Electronics Association said in a statement that the sector has transitioned from being 78 percent import-dependent in 2014 to 97 percent self-sufficiency.
- ♦ Only three percent of the total mobile phones sold in India are now imported.
- ♦ India's mobile phone production is nearing 20 lakh crore rupees in a decade of unprecedented growth.
- ♦ India produced 2.45 billion units of mobile phones during these ten years, against a goal of 2.5 billion units.
- ♦ China is the largest producer of mobile phones; Indonesia stands at 3rd.

- ♦ Mask making and manuscript painting of Majuli, an island-district of Assam, have received Geographical Indication (GI) tags.

- ♦ Mask making or 'Mukha Shilpa' of Majuli is an age-old art form in the island, dating back to the 16th century. It is one of the most famous traditional crafts still practiced in Majuli, the world's largest inhabited river island.

41. North India's First Government Homeopathic College to be Established in Kathua

- ♦ Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology, Dr Jitendra Singh, announced the establishment of North India's first Government Homeopathic College in the Jasrota area of Kathua district, Jammu and Kashmir.
- ♦ The project, funded centrally at Rs 80 crore, reflects a significant stride in healthcare and education infrastructure development in the region.
- ♦ The open space will be utilised later on for construction of an auditorium, playground, etc.

42. Jal Shakti Ministry launched Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain 2024

- ♦ The Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat has launched the "Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain" campaign 2024.
- ♦ It is the fifth edition of the campaign. The launch of Catch the Rain Campaign was scheduled to be held at the NDMC Convention Centre in New Delhi.
- ♦ The theme of the Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain Campaign 2024 is Nari Shaktise Jal Shakti.

43. PM Modi inaugurates 15 Airport Projects

- ♦ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated 15 airport projects, including the revamped Terminal 1 of the Indira Gandhi International Airport in Delhi, worth over Rs.9,800 crore.
- ♦ The project virtually launched by the PM during an event at Uttar Pradesh's Azamgarh included 12 new terminal buildings of Pune, Kolhapur, Gwalior, Jabalpur, Delhi, Lucknow, Aligarh, Azamgarh, Chitrakoot, Moradabad, Shravasti and Adampur Airports.
- ♦ In the fiscal year 2023-24, the Airports Authority of India (AAI) has already operationalized state-of-the-art new integrated terminal buildings at Chennai, Port Blair, Surat, and Tiruchirappalli Airports.

44. Tata Power Solar completes India's largest solar-BESS project in Chhattisgarh

- ♦ Tata Power Solar Systems Limited (TPSSL), a subsidiary of Tata Power Renewable Energy Limited (TPREL), has completed India's largest Solar and Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) project at Rajnandgaon in Chhattisgarh.
- ♦ It comprises a 100 MW Solar PV Project and a 120 MWh Utility Scale Battery Energy Storage System (BESS).
- ♦ TPSSL secured the Rs 945 crore project from SECI in December 2021, handling engineering, construction, and commissioning of the project.

- ♦ India's industrial production grew 3.8 per cent in January 2024, according to official data released by the government.
- ♦ Factory output measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) witnessed a growth of 5.8 per cent in January 2023.
- ♦ The IIP grew 5.9 per cent during April 2023 to January 2024 compared to a 5.5 per cent expansion in the year-ago period.

47. Anurag Thakur launches PB-SHABD to offer news feed to media outlets

- ♦ Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Singh Thakur launched PB-SHABD, a news-sharing service from Prasar Bharati in New Delhi.
- ♦ PB-SHABD stands for Prasar Bharati – Shared audio-visuals for Broadcast Dissemination
- ♦ He also launched revamped websites of Akashvani News and DD News and updated News on the Air mobile app.
- ♦ CEO of Prasar Bharti - Gaurav Dwivedi

48. Ministry of Defence approves three lakh vacancies to expand NCC

- ♦ Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved a proposal for the expansion of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) with the addition of three lakh cadet vacancies.
- ♦ This decision comes in response to the growing demand for NCC enrolment from educational institutions across India.
- ♦ Since its inception in 1948 with just 20,000 cadets, the NCC will now have a sanctioned strength of 20 lakh cadets, solidifying its position as the world's largest uniformed youth organization.
- ♦ The expansion plan aims to evenly distribute vacancies across all States and Union Territories, reducing the waiting list of institutions seeking NCC affiliation.

49. Maharashtra's Ahmednagar to be renamed 'Ahilyanagar'

- ♦ The Maharashtra Cabinet has approved to rename Ahmednagar district as Ahilya Nagar after the 18th-century Maratha queen Ahilyabai Holkar.
- ♦ The proposal to rename the city was first announced by Maharashtra chief minister Eknath Shinde in May last year on the 298th birth anniversary of the 18th-century queen Ahilyabai Holkar.
- ♦ Following the approval, Curry Road will be renamed Lalbaug, Sandhurst Road will now be known as Dongri, and Marine Lines will be renamed Mumbadevi.

50. SC ordered Election Commission to Publish Data on Electoral Bond

- ♦ The Election Commission of India on its official website on March 14 published the electoral bonds data as ordered by the Supreme Court of India (SC).
- ♦ The publication of the electoral bond data came almost a month after the Supreme Court struck down the 2018 scheme calling it “unconstitutional.”
- ♦ In the data on electoral bonds, the only information available about donors is the name of their company or individual.
- ♦ The SBI confirmed in an affidavit that 22,217 electoral bonds were purchased and 22,030 redeemed by political parties between April 1, 2019, and February 15, 2024.
- ♦ The SBI shared two sets of data with the Election Commission.
- ♦ The first set includes the name of the purchaser of the electoral bond, date, and denomination. The second list lays out details of the political party and dates and denomination of bonds encashed.
- ♦ The data reveals key details like the name of the electoral bond purchaser and the amount they donated through the bond.
- ♦ It pertains to the purchase of electoral bonds in the denomination of ₹1 lakh, ₹10 lakh and ₹1 crore.
- ♦ The donors include a range of companies like Megha Engineering and Infrastructure, Future Gaming and Hotel Services (Lottery Martin), Sun Pharma, Lakshmi Mittal, Sula Wine, DLF Commercial Developers, etc. Who are the biggest donors?
- ♦ In the data released, there are 1,260 companies and individuals that purchased electoral bonds worth ₹12,769 crore. The top 20, all companies, accounted for ₹5,945 crore—or nearly half of the total amount donated through electoral bonds.

51. Shipping Ministry approves projects worth ₹645-crore in Assam to boost tourism

- ♦ India's Shipping Ministry has approved waterways projects worth ₹645 crore on Brahmaputra in Assam.
- ♦ Projects, aimed at boosting river tourism, will be implemented with financial assistance from the Centre.
- ♦ Projects will involve the creation of slipways at strategic locations in Dhubri and Majuli, new passenger terminals at Ghagor in North Lakhimpur and Bahari in Barpeta district of Assam.
- ♦ There will be additional passenger terminals in Goalpara, Guijan, Kurua, Dhubri, Disangmukh & Matmora.

52. NHPC bags 200 MW capacity solar power project in Gujarat

- ♦ State-run hydro power major NHPC has bagged a 200-megawatt (MW) capacity solar power project to be set up at the Gujarat State Electricity Corporation's (GSECL) 1,125 MW RE Park in Khavda.
- ♦ NHPC will develop the project on a build-own-and-operate basis at a tentative development cost of about ₹847 crore.
- ♦ The project was secured at a tariff of ₹2.66 per unit and will be completed in a period of 18 months.

- ♦ The project will generate about 473 million units (MU) in the first year of commissioning and the cumulative generation from the project over a period of 25 years would be about 10,850 million units.

53. Government launches alternate Auto Fuel Ethanol100

- ♦ Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri has launched Ethanol100, an alternate auto fuel in New Delhi.
- ♦ Ethanol100, a cleaner and greener alternative to gasoline, is a blend of 92 to 94 percent ethanol, 4 to 5 percent motor spirit to provide colour to flame and 1.5 percent Co-solvent higher saturated alcohol.
- ♦ The fuel produces lower emissions of greenhouse gases, a reduction by around 63% on well to wheel basis.
- ♦ Ethanol100 will help to mitigate the impacts of climate change and improve air quality. Prominent two-wheeler manufacturers are already undertaking trials for Ethanol100 compliant vehicles.

- ♦ Srinagar hosted the first-ever Formula 4 car racing demonstration event on the banks of the world-famous Dal Lake.
- ♦ The event enthralled locals and motorsport fans as they witnessed stunts performed by professional Formula 4 drivers.
- ♦ Sleek racing cars roared along a 1.7 km track from Lalit Ghat on the banks of Dal Lake to Nehru Park in the city.

55. India's first integrated Oil Palm Processing Unit by 3F Oil Palm starts commercial operations

- ♦ India's first integrated oil palm processing unit in Arunachal Pradesh started operation by one of India's largest oil palm development companies, 3F Oil Palm.
- ♦ A new factory has been established in the Lower Dibang Valley district of India's northeast state. This factory is part of Mission Palm Oil and is India's first oil palm factory under NMEO-OP.
- ♦ This integrated Oil Palm project will include a cutting-edge oil palm factory (Palm Oil Processing and Refinery), a zero-discharge effluent plant, a palm waste-based power plant, and additional structures and go-downs for support purposes.
- ♦ This factory marks the first Oil Palm factory in Arunachal Pradesh and India's first Oil Palm Factory under NMEO-OP.
- ♦ 3F Oil Palm's state-of-the-art Integrated Oil Palm Processing Unit has been designed to process fresh fruit bunches (FFBs) into high-quality palm oil with an impressive capacity of 10 metric tons per hour.

56. Election Commission launches 'Mission 414' campaign in Himachal

- ♦ The Election Commission has launched a special campaign in Himachal Pradesh to boost voter turnout in 414 polling stations with less than 60% voting during the last Lok Sabha polls.
- ♦ The main focus of the campaign — "Mission 414" — is increasing the vote percentage in 414 identified polling stations which registered less than 60% voting in the last Lok Sabha polls.
- ♦ Awareness campaigns and cultural events would be held besides making these 414 stations model

polling stations.

- ◆ Booth youth icons from first time voters would be roped in and special invitation cards made by children would be given to prospective voters.

57. Tata Sons announces sale of 0.6% Stake in TCS for over ₹9,300 crore

- ◆ Tata Sons, the holding company of the Tata Group, will be selling 2.34 crore shares or 0.65 per cent equity of Tata Consultancy Services through a block deal for ₹9,362.3 crore (\$1.13 billion).
- ◆ According to the December-end filing, Tata Sons holds a 72.38 per cent stake in TCS.
- ◆ Holding companies and promoter entities usually sell stakes in group firms to generate cash to pay down debt and stabilise balance sheets.

58. ICRA forecasts Indian IT service industry growth at 3-5% in FY25

- ◆ Indian IT sector's revenue growth is expected to come at a tepid 3-5% in FY25, a domestic rating agency ICRA.
- ◆ This is the second consecutive year when the credit rating agency has forecasted a growth rate in the range of 3-5 per cent for sector.
- ◆ The sector's hiring will "remain muted" in the near-term until the growth momentum picks up, ICRA Ratings said.

59. India's 1st Battery Energy storage GigaFactory to be launched in J&K

- ◆ GoodEnough Energy will start operations at India's first battery energy storage gigafactory in the northern region of Jammu and Kashmir by October.
- ◆ The facility will help industry in cutting more than 5 million tons of carbon emissions in a year.
- ◆ GoodEnough has already spent 1.5 billion rupees (\$18.07 million) on the 7 gigawatts per hour (GWH) facility and will spend 3 billion rupees by 2027 to raise capacity to 20 GWH.
- ◆ Battery energy storage projects are critical to India's ambitious plan to expand its renewable energy capacity to 500 gigawatts (GW) by 2030, from 178 GW at present.
- ◆ India has set a 2070 goal for becoming net zero.

60. IIT Madras develops customisable 'Electric Standing Wheelchair'

- ◆ IIT Madras has developed an indigenous electric standing wheelchair called 'NeoStand,' claimed to be India's most customizable wheelchair for the benefit of wheelchair users.
- ◆ The wheelchair was launched at the campus in the presence of Professor V Kamakoti, Director of IIT Madras, faculty, researchers, dignitaries, supporters of this project, and users of these rehabilitative devices.
- ◆ The NeoStand is a compact standing wheelchair equipped with navigation for its motorized standing mechanism. Users can easily switch from sitting to standing at the touch of a button.

61. GRID-INDIA is now a Miniratna Company

- ◆ Grid Controller of India Limited (GRID-INDIA) achieved a significant milestone by being conferred with the status of Miniratna Category-I Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE).
- ◆ This recognition, bestowed upon by the Ministry of Power, Government of India, underscores GRID-INDIA's pivotal role in the nation's power landscape.
- ◆ Established in 2009, GRID-INDIA holds the crucial mandate of overseeing the seamless and

uninterrupted operation of the Indian Power System, ensuring the efficient transfer of electric power within and across regions, facilitating trans-national power exchanges with a focus on reliability, economy, and sustainability.

62. 'Operation Indravati' to evacuate stranded Indians in Haiti launched

- ♦ India has launched 'Operation Indravati' to evacuate its citizens stranded in war-torn Haiti amid the intense fighting between the armed groups and the government.
- ♦ 12 citizens have been successfully rescued to the Caribbean nation Dominican Republic and further thanked its government for their support.

➤ What's happening in Haiti?

- ♦ The Caribbean nation of Haiti has been plagued by widespread gang violence for over two years since the July 2021 assassination of President Jovenel Moise.
- ♦ In the power vacuum that followed the assassination, the country's de facto leader, Prime Minister Ariel Henry, assumed power, with the support of several nations.

63. Bharat Biotech starts clinical trials of Tuberculosis vaccine MTBVAC in India

- ♦ Bharat Biotech International Ltd started clinical trials of the Tuberculosis vaccine MTBVAC on adults in India.
- ♦ This is the first vaccine against Tuberculosis derived from a human source by the Spanish biopharmaceutical company, Biofabri.
- ♦ The trials are carried out by Bharat Biotech in close collaboration with Biofabri.

64. Government allocated Rs 6200 cr to boost RRB

- ♦ The union government has allocated Rs 6212.03 crore to regional rural banks under the recapitalization scheme.
- ♦ Under the scheme, recapitalization support is provided to RRBs to maintain the minimum prescribed capital-to-risk (Weighted) Assets ratio of nine per cent.
- ♦ The performance of RRBs has improved significantly, with a consolidated CRAR (Capital to Risk-weighted Assets Ratio) at an all-time high of 13.83 per cent as of December 31, 2023.

65. World's largest copper manufacturing plant owned by Adani Group

- ♦ Billionaire Gautam Adani-led group has started the first phase of the world's largest single-location copper manufacturing plant at Mundra in Gujarat, which will help cut India's dependence on imports and aid energy transition.
- ♦ The 1st phase of the facility will produce 0.5 million tonnes a year of refined copper.
- ♦ India joins China and other nations that are rapidly expanding production of copper.
- ♦ India's per capita copper consumption is around 0.6 kg and the global average is kg.

66. India's first Artificial Intelligence based Film 'IRAH' trailer launched

- ♦ The trailer and song launch of the first Hindi film on this subject, "IRAH," took place in Mumbai.
- ♦ The movie features Rohit Bose Roy, Rajesh Sharma, Karishma Kotak, and Rakshith Bhandary in prominent roles.
- ♦ The movie is Produced by Big Films Media and directed by Sam Bhattacharjee. The film is set to release nationwide in theaters on April 4th through Iamplex Digital Theatrical Distribution.

- ♦ This intricate design pays tribute to the region's rich cultural and architectural heritage.
- ♦ Nagara style got its fame from the Gupta dynasty and continued to flourish through various regional kingdoms and empires that ruled over the northern parts of India.
- ♦ One notable aspect of this temple is that it can hold 1,008 idols of Lord Mahadev and 12 Jyotirlingas within its sacred boundaries.

1. Nicaragua becomes first Spanish-Speaking nation to recognize IPS

- ♦ Nicaragua has become the first Spanish-speaking nation to officially recognize the Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP) or Indian Pharma standards.
- ♦ This development follows the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Pharmacopoeia Cooperation between the Governments of India and Nicaragua.
- ♦ The move is expected to foster stronger ties between the two nations in the areas of healthcare, encouraging the exchange of expertise and resources for improved medical standards.
- ♦ The Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP), compiled by the Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC) under the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare in India, serves as the official compendium of standards for drugs.
- ♦ The legal significance of the IP within India, enshrined in the Second Schedule of the Drugs & Cosmetics Act, 1940, necessitates adherence to its standards for all imported, manufactured, and distributed drugs within the country.

2. France become first country to enshrine abortion rights in its constitution

- ♦ France has become the first country in the world to enshrine abortion rights in its constitution.
- ♦ French lawmakers from both houses of the Parliament, in a special session, voted 780 to 72 in favor of the move to amend the Constitution.
- ♦ The amendment states that there is a guaranteed freedom to abortion in France.
- ♦ France has a long history of supporting abortion rights. The voluntary ending of pregnancy became legal in France in 1975 with a law named after Simone Veil, the health minister who supported it.

3. Panama becomes 97th member of International Solar Alliance

- ♦ Panama has officially become the 97th member of the International Solar Alliance (ISA).

- ♦ Moreover, on March 5, Malta became the 119th country to join the International Solar Alliance.
- ♦ The International Solar Alliance (ISA) is an action-oriented, member-driven, collaborative platform for increased deployment of solar energy technologies as a means for bringing energy access, ensuring energy security, and driving energy transition in its member countries.

4. Sweden officially becomes 32nd member of NATO

- ♦ Sweden has officially become the 32nd member of NATO after it completed the accession process in Washington.
- ♦ The handover of documents took place at a ceremony two years after Sweden applied to join the military alliance following the full-scale war between Russia and Ukraine in February 2022.
- ♦ The foundations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) were officially laid down on 4 April 1949 with the signing of the North Atlantic Treaty, more popularly known as the Washington Treaty.

5. New Zealand bans disposable E-Cigarettes and Vapes

- ♦ The New Zealand government will ban the sale of disposable e-cigarettes, increase fines on retailers that sell to those younger than 18 years old and better regulate retailers.
- ♦ The New Zealand government has received significant criticism for rolling back a world-first law banning tobacco sales for future generations.
- ♦ It is committed to reducing smoking but is just taking a different approach, including further regulations around vaping.

6. Saudi Arabia to participate in Miss Universe event in historic first

- ♦ Saudi Arabia officially joined the Miss Universe pageant with Romy Alqahtani as the Islamic country's first-ever representative.
- ♦ This is another step for Saudi Arabia, which has been shedding its conservative cloak under Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman Al Saud.
- ♦ Romy Alqahtani, a 27-year-old model, would be the first participant from the country in the international beauty pageant.
- ♦ Last year, Miss Nicaragua Sheynnis Palacios was crowned Miss Universe 2023.

Chapter 14: Banking & Financial

1. RBI cancels licence of Rajasthan-based Sumerpur Mercantile Urban Coop Bank

- ♦ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has cancelled the licence of Sumerpur Mercantile Urban Cooperative Bank, Pali (Rajasthan), as the lender does not have adequate capital and earning prospects.
- ♦ The Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Rajasthan, has also been requested to issue an order for

winding up the bank and appoint a liquidator.

- ♦ On liquidation, every depositor will be entitled to receive deposit insurance claim amount of his/her deposits up to Rs 5 lakh from Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation (DICGC).
- ♦ As per the data submitted by the bank, 99.13 per cent of the depositors are entitled to receive full amount of their deposits from DICGC.

2. GST Collections Jump 12.5% YoY to Rs 1.68 Lakh Crore in Feb 2024

- ♦ Gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue collected for February 2024 is ₹1,68,337 crore, marking a robust 12.5% increase compared to that in the same month in 2023.
- ♦ This growth was driven by a 13.9% rise in GST from domestic transactions and 8.5% increase in GST from import of goods.
- ♦ GST revenue net of refunds for February 2024 is ₹1.51 lakh crore which is a growth of 13.6% over that for the same period last year.
- ♦ Breakdown of February 2024 Collections- Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST)- ₹31,785 crore State Goods and Services Tax (SGST)- ₹39,615 crore Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST)- ₹84,098 crore, including ₹38,593 crore collected on imported goods Cess- ₹12,839 crore, including ₹984 crore collected on imported goods

3. FIU imposes 5.49 crore fine on Paytm Payments Bank

- ♦ Financial Intelligence Unit - India (FIU-IND) has hit Paytm Payments Bank Ltd with a hefty penalty of Rs 5,49,00,000 for alleged violations of anti-money laundering rules under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).
- ♦ The penalty pertains to issues within a business segment that was discontinued two years ago.
- ♦ The bank was accused of violating rules outlined in the PMLA and its associated regulations, as well as guidelines issued by the Director FIU-IND.
- ♦ The investigation was prompted by specific information provided by law enforcement agencies regarding certain entities believed to be involved in illicit activities, including online gambling.

4. Flipkart unveils its UPI handle to boost India's digital evolution

- ♦ Flipkart has launched its UPI (Unified Payments Interface) handle to enhance digital payment offerings to all users, including the e-commerce major's over 500 million customers, and boost India's digital evolution.
- ♦ Powered by Axis Bank, Flipkart UPI will initially be available for Android users.
- ♦ Customers can register for UPI with @fkaxis handle and can do fund transfers and checkout payments using the Flipkart app.

5. Kotak Mahindra Bank introduces Smart Choice Gold Loan

- ♦ Kotak Mahindra Bank Ltd. (KMBL) has launched 'Smart Choice Gold Loan' for customers.
- ♦ This product comes with features including a fixed monthly interest rate starting from 0.88%, same-day disbursement, flexible repayment options, and minimal documentation requirements.
- ♦ This new product is designed to leverage the significant gold reserves held by Indian households, providing an easy and efficient way to meet their financial needs.
- ♦ The launch of the Smart Choice Gold Loan comes at a time when the demand for gold-backed

6. Infibeam Avenues get RBI's authorization to payment aggregator licence

- ♦ India's first listed AI-powered fintech company, Infibeam Avenues has received the final authorization from RBI to operate as a payment aggregator for its payment gateway brand, CCAvenue.
- ♦ The RBI had in March 2020 introduced the PA framework, which necessitates payment gateways to secure an aggregator licence for acquiring merchants and delivering digital payment solutions.
- ♦ More than 10 million merchants are on Infibeam's platform, and this year, the company has already crossed half a million merchants onboarding in 1H FY24.

7. 30 banks join RBI's UDGM portal for unclaimed deposits

- ♦ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced that 30 banks are now participating in the UDGM portal, designed for individuals to search for their unclaimed deposits/accounts.
- ♦ UDGM -- Unclaimed Deposits-Gateway to Access inforMation -- is an online portal developed by RBI.
- ♦ It facilitates the registered users to search unclaimed deposits/accounts across multiple banks in one place in a centralised manner.
- ♦ All unclaimed deposits/accounts that are part of the Depositor Education and Awareness (DEA) Fund of RBI can be searched in the UDGM portal.

8. Kotak Life introduces Non-Linked Par Product Kotak G.A.I.N

- ♦ Private sector life insurer Kotak Life Insurance has launched a non-linked participating product Kotak G.A.I.N which offers long-term saving or income.
- ♦ The minimum annual premium payable to avail the product is Rs 50,000.
- ♦ While taking the policy, the minimum age of the policyholder should be 90 days while the policy maturing age should be minimum 40 years and maximum 85 years.
- ♦ The product provides three options to the policyholder to choose from.
- ♦ Under the first option, policyholders can receive regular income from the 1st month of policy issuance for monthly payout mode and 1st year onwards for annual payout mode.
- ♦ Under the second option, income benefits will be used to purchase additional sum assured throughout the policy term and receive it as lump sum or withdraw as per convenience.

- ◆ The government has kept the interest rates unchanged on various small savings schemes for the first quarter of the next fiscal, beginning April 1, 2024.
- ◆ With this, the interest rates will remain unchanged till June 30, 2024.
- ◆ These schemes offer guaranteed returns at regular intervals compounded monthly, quarterly or annually as the case may be.
- ◆ These instruments cater to conservative investors and offer guaranteed but low returns and range between 6-8 per cent.

12. BoB launches green term deposit scheme with 7.15% interest

- ◆ Bank of Baroda (BoB) has launched the BoB Earth Green Term Deposit Scheme, aimed at raising deposits for financing eligible environment-friendly projects and sectors.
- ◆ The scheme offers customers the dual benefits of stable financial returns and contribution to a greener planet.
- ◆ It offers annual interest rates, ranging from 6.75 per cent for a tenure of 12 to 18 months to 7.15 per cent for 777 days.
- ◆ Additionally, for longer tenures of 1,111 days, 1,717 days, and 2,201 days, the interest rates are set at 6.40 per cent per annum.

13. IndusInd Bank launched all-in-one payment wearables

- ◆ IndusInd Bank has introduced 'Indus PayWear,' a new wearable payment solution, available on Mastercard.
- ◆ These wearables enable users to tokenise their IndusInd Bank cards for tap-and-pay transactions at contactless Point-of-Sale (PoS) terminals worldwide.
- ◆ Indus Paywear aims to deliver unparalleled flexibility, convenience, and security to users.
- ◆ It is a fine example of how Mastercard leverages its expertise to allow consumers the power to choose between and make payments using their favorite wearable device.

14. Retail inflation dropped a tad to 4-month low of 5.09% in February 2024

- ◆ India's retail inflation eased marginally to 5.09 per cent on an annual basis in February as against 5.10 per cent in the previous month, data released by the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation.
- ◆ The number has remained within the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) tolerance band of 2-6 per cent.
- ◆ On a sequential basis, the inflation rate increased to 0.16 per cent against a contraction of (-)0.11 per cent in the previous month.

- ♦ The rural inflation rate remained unchanged at 5.34 per cent, meanwhile, the urban inflation rate declined to 4.78 per cent from 4.92 per cent in January.

15. Kotak Mahindra Bank sells 2% stake in KFin Tech

- ♦ Kotak Mahindra Bank has sold a 2% stake in KFin Technologies through the open market for Rs 208 crore.
- ♦ The private sector lender sold 3,470,000 shares of KFin Technologies at Rs 600.28 a share, bulk deals data on the BSE showed.
- ♦ As of December end, Kotak Mahindra Bank held a 9.80% stake in KFin Technologies.
- ♦ Kotak Mahindra Bank invested Rs 310 crore in KFin Technologies in September 2021.

16. RBI bars Federal Bank, South Indian Bank from issuing co-branded credit cards

- ♦ Following the directions by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), private sector lenders Federal Bank and South Indian Bank stopped issuing co-branded credit cards to new customers on account of regulatory deficiencies.
- ♦ South Indian Bank said that it will not onboard new customers on their co-branded credit cards until it is fully compliant with directions under RBI Master Direction on Credit Card and Debit Card issuance.
- ♦ However, the lender added that it will continue to service the existing customers who hold co-branded credit cards.
- ♦ South Indian Bank has one co-branded credit card in partnership with State Bank of India (SBI), which is available in two variants SimplySAVE and Platinum.

17. Total of 22,217 electoral bonds purchased: SBI to SC

- ♦ The State Bank of India (SBI) has told the Supreme Court that a total of 22,217 electoral bonds were purchased by political parties between April 1, 2019 and February 15 this year, out of which 22,030 were redeemed.
- ♦ In a compliance affidavit filed in the apex court, the SBI said as per the court's direction, it has made available the details of electoral bonds to the Election Commission of India before the close of business hours on March 12.
- ♦ A total number of 22,217 bonds were purchased during the period April 1, 2019 till February 15, 2024.
- ♦ The affidavit said between April 1, 2019 to April 11, 2019, a total of 3,346 electoral bonds were purchased and 1,609 redeemed.

18. Private banks' share in deposits rises to 34%

- ♦ The share of private sector banks in total deposits has risen significantly, reaching 34% as of December 2023, up from 25% at the end of the financial year 2017-18.
- ♦ This growth has been driven by aggressive interest rate offerings and improved customer relationship management strategies adopted by private banks.
- ♦ The share of public sector banks in the space has declined to 59% from 66% at the

end of the financial year 2017-18, according to the Reserve Bank of India data.

- ♦ The ability of private banks to swiftly raise interest rates on fixed deposits has helped them increase their share in total deposits.

19. RBI imposes ₹1.40 cr monetary penalty on Bank of India

- ♦ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed a penalty of Rs 1.4 crore on Bank of India for non-compliance with certain regulatory norms.
- ♦ It has also imposed a penalty of Rs 29.55 lakh on private sector lender Bandhan Bank for non-compliance with certain directions.
- ♦ The penalty on Bank of India has been imposed for non-compliance with the RBI's directions related to 'interest rate on deposits', 'customer service in banks', 'interest rate on advances', and contravention of provisions of Credit Information Companies Rules 2006.

20. India's WPI inflation eases to four-month low of 0.20 per cent in Feb

- ♦ Data released by the Ministry of Commerce & Industry showed that India's wholesale price inflation eased further to a four-month low of 0.20 per cent in February on an annual basis, as against 0.27 per cent in January.
- ♦ The sequential WPI rate for February grew 0.07 per cent against a contraction of (-)0.33 per cent in the month before.
- ♦ Inflation for food articles stood at 6.95 per cent in February. For the primary articles segment, the inflation rate in February surged to 4.49 per cent from 3.84 per cent in the preceding month.

21. Axis Bank to support Tata Memorial-supported National Cancer Grid

- ♦ A national tumour biobank and cancer teleconsultation network are among the projects that will be supported by a ₹100 crore contribution towards the National Cancer Grid (NCG), from Axis Bank.
- ♦ As part of the five-year partnership, Axis Bank will support NCG, a network of 300-plus cancer centres across the country, coordinated by the Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH), under the Tata Memorial Centre.
- ♦ The aim is to improve cancer care and research, in terms of access and digital adoption on formalising a Memorandum of Understanding with Tata Memorial.

22. FinMin notifies Rs 90 coin to commemorate 90 years of RBI

- ♦ The Finance Ministry has notified the issuance of a special commemorative coin of Rs 90 denomination to mark the completion of 90 years of the RBI.
- ♦ One side of the coin shall bear the RBI's logo in the centre, with RBI@90 inscribed below.
- ♦ This will be a silver coin with 99.99% silver purity, weighing about 40 grams
- ♦ The face of the coin shall bear the Lion Capital of Ashoka Pillar in the centre with "Satyamev Jayate" inscribed in the Devnagari script below it.

23. RBI imposes ₹1.31 cr. penalty on Tamilnad Mercantile Bank

- ♦ The Reserve Bank of India has imposed penalties on DCB Bank and Tamilnad Mercantile Bank for non-compliance with certain directions related to 'interest rate on advances'.
- ♦ A monetary penalty of Rs 63.6 lakh has been imposed on DCB Bank.
- ♦ A penalty of Rs 1.31 crore has been imposed on Tamilnad Mercantile Bank for non-compliance with certain directions issued by it on 'Interest Rate on Advances' and 'Central Repository of Information on Large Credits (CRILC) - Revision in Reporting.

24. Gross Direct Tax collections for FY 2023-24 register a growth of 18.74%

- ♦ The provisional figures of Direct Tax collections for the Financial Year 2023-24 (as on 17.03.2024) show that Net collections are at Rs. 18,90,259 crore, compared to Rs. 15,76,776 crore in the corresponding period of the preceding Financial Year (i.e. FY 2022-23), representing an increase of 19.88%.
- ♦ The Net Direct Tax collection of Rs. 18,90,259 crore (as on 17.03.2024) includes Corporation Tax (CIT) at Rs. 9,14,469 crore (net of refund) and Personal Income Tax (PIT) including Securities Transaction Tax (STT) at Rs. 9,72,224 crore (net of refund).

25. LIC world's strongest insurance brand: Brand Finance Insurance

- ♦ Insurance behemoth Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has emerged as the strongest insurance brand globally, according to a report Brand Finance Insurance 100 2024.
- ♦ The report said that LIC's brand value remains steady at USD 9.8 billion, accompanied by a brand strength index score of 88.3 and an associated AAA brand strength rating.
- ♦ Following LIC, the rankings highlight Cathay Life Insurance as the second strongest brand, experiencing a 9 per cent increase in brand value to USD 4.9 billion, closely followed by NRMA Insurance, which saw an 82 per cent rise in brand value to USD 1.3 billion.

26. Innoviti Payments, Concerto Software get RBI payment aggregator licences

- ♦ Offline point-of-sales deploying company Innoviti Payments and payment gateway Vegaah, which is run by Concerto Software and Systems, have secured the online payment aggregator (PA) licence from the Reserve Bank of India, joining the likes of MSwipe, Razorpay, Cashfree, and Zomato.
- ♦ CCAvenue, which is run by listed fintech company Infibeam Avenues, also received its PA licence from the RBI earlier this month.
- ♦ As PAs, these companies are authorized to settle ecommerce transactions. The licence also brings these payment companies directly within the purview of RBI regulations.
- ♦ Bengaluru-based Innoviti has around 2,500 online merchants who are using its online payment system named 'Innoviti Link'.

27. RBI imposes Rs 59.90 lakh fine on Nashik's Janalaxmi Cooperative Bank

- ♦ The Reserve Bank has imposed a penalty of Rs 59.90 lakh on Nashik-based Janalaxmi Cooperative Bank for non-compliance with regulations.
- ♦ The bank had failed to constitute a board of management within the extended timeline granted by

RBI, sanctioned credit facilities to its nominal members in excess of the prescribed limit, and, opened/renewed term deposits at interest rates higher than those offered by the State Bank of India for the same tenor.

- ♦ The central bank also imposed a penalty of Rs 28.30 lakh on Solapur Janata Sahakari Bank for appointing a member on its board of management who did not satisfy the 'fit and proper' criteria and failure to reconstitute the panel within the specified time and contravention of Supervisory Action Framework by the lender by sanctioning fresh loans carrying risk weights of more than 100 per cent in FY22.

28. Government to borrow ₹7.5-lakh crore in April-Sept

- ♦ The government will borrow ₹7.5-lakh crore between April 1 and September 30.
- ♦ The interim Budget has set a target of ₹14.13-lakh crore of gross borrowing during FY25 to bridge the deficit between expenditure and Income.
- ♦ This means 53 per cent of the yearly target is to be borrowed during the first half of the current fiscal, which is lower than the previous years' number of 60 per cent or more.

29. SEBI cancels investment banking licence of Karvy Investor Services

- ♦ Capital markets regulator SEBI has cancelled the registration of Karvy Investor Services Ltd. (KISL) as a merchant banker for breach of eligibility criteria.
- ♦ The order came after the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) conducted an inspection of Karvy Investor Services during March 15-17, 2023 and in the onsite inspection, the regulator found that the merchant banker was not functioning or operational both at the registered as well as in the correspondence address.
- ♦ In April 2023, SEBI barred Karvy Investor Services from taking new clients for allegedly violating regulatory norms.
- ♦ It had found that KISL neither had any physical infrastructure nor any employee working for it.

30. Bank of India to raise Rs 10,000 cr via infrastructure bonds

- ♦ Bank of India (BoI)'s board has given approval to raise Rs 10,000 crore through long-term infrastructure bonds to fund infrastructure projects.
- ♦ The fund would be raised in 2024-25, BoI said in a regulatory filing.
- ♦ Recently, many banks including SBI have issued infrastructure bonds to secure funds that are solely dedicated to advancing various infrastructure development projects.
- ♦ These bonds help in building roads, bridges, airports, power plants, and telecommunications networks etc and addressing the infrastructure deficit of the country.

31. Axis Bank launches Digital US Dollar Fixed Deposits for NRIs at GIFT City

- ♦ Axis Bank has launched the digital US dollar Fixed Deposits (FD) tailored for Non-Resident Indian (NRI) customers at the IFSC Banking Unit (IBU) situated in GIFT City, Gujarat.
- ♦ The US Dollar fixed deposit scheme offers a diverse array of investment tenures ranging from seven days to an extensive ten years.
- ♦ Additionally, customers retain the flexibility to request partial or full premature closure of their FD through the Axis Bank mobile application, enhancing their control and convenience over their

- ◆ With this introduction, Axis Bank becomes the first bank to offer a digital journey for GIFT City Deposits.
- ◆ Income Tax department has levied a penalty of Rs 564.44 crore on Bank of India, the public sector lender.
- ◆ The bank has received the order under Section 270A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 from the Income Tax Department, Assessment Unit pertaining to AY2018-19, wherein the penalty of Rs 564.44 crore has been imposed on various disallowances made.

1. DRDO conducts successful flight test of VSHORADS missile

- ◆ Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) conducted a successful flight test of a Very Short-Range Air Defence System (VSHORADS) missile from a ground-based portable launcher off the coast of Odisha from the Integrated Test Range in Chandipur.
- ◆ The test was carried out against high-speed unmanned aerial targets under different interception scenarios.
- ◆ The VSHORADS is propelled by a dual thrust solid motor and would be used for neutralising low altitude aerial threats at short ranges.
- ◆ The VSHORADS is a Man Portable Air Defence System (MANPAD) indigenously developed by Research Centre Imarat (RCI) in collaboration with other DRDO laboratories and other industry partners.

2. Iran launches 'Pars 1' satellite into orbit from Russia

- ◆ Russia has launched an Iranian-made research satellite into orbit amid rising tensions with the West.
- ◆ The Pars 1 remote sensing and imaging satellite was launched by a Russian Soyuz rocket from the

Vostochny Cosmodrome and will scan Iran's topography from an orbit of 310 miles (500km).

- ♦ The launch of Pars 1 follows the August 2022 deployment of Iran's Khayyam satellite, also facilitated by Russia.
- ♦ This pattern of collaboration indicates a strengthening of scientific and technological ties between Iran and Russia, amidst broader geopolitical tensions.

3. Navy commissions strategically important base INS Jatayu in Lakshadweep Islands

- ♦ The Indian Navy has commissioned its new base "INS Jatayu" at Minicoy Island, Lakshadweep. It will bolster its operational capabilities within the strategically important Lakshadweep islands.
- ♦ Jatayu has been commissioned under the command of Commandant Vrat Baghel.
- ♦ The crest of the INS Jatayu - depicting a bird signifying Jatayu, a character in the Hindu epic Ramayana -- was hoisted after the unveiling of the commissioning plaque.

4. CCS gives nod to 5th generation aircraft project worth ₹15,000 crore

- ♦ The Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) has approved the project for the design and development of India's fifth-generation fighter jet, Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA), to be undertaken by the Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO).
- ♦ The AMCA is envisaged as a 25-tonne twin-engine stealth aircraft with an internal weapons bay and Diverterless Supersonic Intake which has been developed in India for the first time.
- ♦ It is intended to have an internal carriage of 1,500 kg of payload and 5,500 kg of external payload with 6,500 kg of internal fuel.
- ♦ The development of AMCA is planned to be carried out in two phases, an MK1 with the General Electric F414 engine and an Mk2 with a more powerful engine planned to be co-developed in partnership with Safran of France for which discussions are underway.

5. DRDO successfully conducts Mission Divyastra

- ♦ Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has conducted first successful flight test of indigenously developed Agni-5 missile with Multiple Independently Targetable Re-Entry Vehicle (MIRV) technology.
- ♦ The flight test named Mission Divyastra was carried out from Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Island in Odisha.
- ♦ Various Telemetry and radar stations tracked and monitored multiple re-entry vehicles. The Mission accomplished the designed parameters.
- ♦ Missiles equipped with MIRV technology can aim multiple targets that can be located hundreds of kilometres apart. Agni-5, which can carry nuclear warheads and hit targets more than 5,000 km away, is aimed mainly at thwarting the challenge from China.
- ♦ The Agni 1 to 4 missiles have ranges from 700 km to 3,500 km and have already been deployed.

6. UK tests a laser weapon that can hit a coin from a kilometer

- ♦ The UK's Ministry of Defence (MoD) has conducted successful tests of its first-ever laser weapon, named "DragonFire".
- ♦ The high-powered laser is designed to target and neutralize drones, offering a potentially low-cost alternative to traditional missiles.

- ♦ The DragonFire laser weapon is expected to significantly reduce the reliance on expensive ammunition, offering a cost-effective solution for air defense.

7. Army raises helicopter unit at Jodhpur to induct Apache attack choppers

- ♦ The Indian Army has raised its first squadron of Apache attack helicopters in Rajasthan's Jodhpur with the aim of supporting ground operations near the Pakistan border.
- ♦ Developed by the US aviation giant Boeing, Apache choppers are known as the 'tanks in the air'.
- ♦ They are advanced multi-mission helicopters with the latest technology and have come to be known the best attack helicopters in the world.

8. Guyana to acquire 2 HAL-Made Dornier 228 Aircraft from India

- ♦ The Indian defence industry is making forays in the Caribbean with the Guyana Defence Force (GDF) planning to soon acquire two new aircraft from New Delhi with a \$23.27 million loan from Export-Import Bank of India.
- ♦ An agreement in this regard was signed between Guyanese Finance Minister and Deputy GM of EXIM Bank.
- ♦ Guyana, which has a substantial Indian diaspora, plans to purchase two HAL (Dornier) 228 planes from Hindustan Aeronautics Limited.

9. LCA Tejas MK-1A completes maiden flight in Bengaluru

- ♦ The Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) has successfully completed the first flight of indigenous light combat aircraft (LCA) Tejas Mark 1A fighter jet in Bengaluru.
- ♦ The aircraft was airborne for 15 minutes during its first flight.
- ♦ The fighter aircraft is likely to be deployed at Nal airbase in Rajasthan's Bikaner near the Pakistan border where it can take care of the western adversary.
- ♦ LCA Mk-1A is an advanced variant of the LCA Mk-1, and it has advanced electronic radar, superior warfare capabilities, and improved maintenance features.

- ◆ Pogba was provisionally suspended by Italy's national anti-doping (NADO Italia) tribunal in September after testing positive for testosterone — a banned substance.
- ◆ The test, performed after Juve's 3-0 Serie A season-opening victory at Udinese on Aug. 20, detected testosterone, a hormone that increases athletes' endurance.
- ◆ The 30-year-old was an unused substitute in that game.

2. Pro Kabaddi League Season 10, Puneri Paltan Clinches Maiden Title

- ◆ Puneri Paltan won the Pro Kabaddi League trophy for the first time as they defeated the Haryana Steelers in the final at the GMC Balayogi Stadium in Hyderabad.
- ◆ The Paltan took an early lead with Ankit opening the scoring for the Steelers and Rahul Sethpal keeping the game interesting with his dynamic offensive moves.

3. B Sai Praneeth announces retirement from international badminton

- ◆ Indian shuttler B Sai Praneeth has announced his retirement from international badminton.
- ◆ The 31-year-old battled nagging injuries since the Olympic Games in Tokyo and decided to hang his boots due to that.
- ◆ In his 24-year-long career, he won a World Championships bronze medal and represented India at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

4. Shahbaz Nadeem retires from international and India's domestic cricket

- ◆ Spinner Shahbaz Nadeem has retired from all forms of international cricket.
- ◆ Now, he wants to play in T20 leagues worldwide.
- ◆ Nadeem took 542 wickets in his first-class career and played two Tests for India.
- ◆ His Test debut was in 2019 when he was 30 years old.
- ◆ The Jharkhand spinner was called in place of Kuldeep Yadav. During the Ranchi Test against South Africa, Shahbaz took 2 wickets for 22 in the first innings and 2 wickets for 18 in the second innings.

5. Sunrisers Hyderabad appoint Pat Cummins as captain for IPL 2024

- ◆ Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) has announced star Australian cricketer Pat Cummins as their new captain for the Indian Premier League (IPL) season 2024.
- ◆ Cummins, who won the ICC World Test Championship and ICC Cricket World Cup with Aussies last year as a captain, replaces South African batter Aiden Markram as the franchise's captain.
- ◆ Cummins was brought by SRH for Rs 20.5 crores in the IPL auctions held last year, making him the second-most expensive player in history.

6. Umpire Marais Erasmus set to retire

- ◆ Veteran South Africa umpire Marais Erasmus has announced his retirement from the ICC Elite Panel of Umpires.
- ◆ His illustrious career spanning over two decades will culminate with his final officiating duty during the second Test between New Zealand and Australia.
- ◆ The Christchurch Test will be Erasmus' 82nd men's Test match as umpire, putting him 10th on the list of umpires to officiate in most Test matches.
- ◆ Erasmus also officiated 124 men's ODIs, 43 men's T20 matches, and 18 women's T20 matches. In 131 international games, he has also served as the TV umpire.
- ◆ Erasmus was the on-field umpire in 25 ICC Men's Cricket World Cup matches, 33 ICC Men's T20 World Cup matches, 18 ICC Women's T20 World Cup matches and six ICC Champions Trophy games. He stood in seven finals of ICC tournaments.

7. James Anderson becomes first pacer to pick 700 Test wickets

- ◆ England great James Anderson has become first-ever fast bowler to pick up 700 Test wickets in 187 matches.
- ◆ The 41-year-old got to the major landmark when he dismissed Kuldeep Yadav on Day 3 of the fifth and final Test against hosts India at the HPCA Stadium in Dharamsala.
- ◆ The legendary fast bowler became only the third man after Sri Lanka's Muttiah Muralitharan (800) in 133 matches and leg-spinner Shane Warne (708) in 145 matches to achieve the feat.
- ◆ Anderson's longevity is a thing of marvel in international cricket as the fast bowler made his debut in 2003 and continues to be one of the leading bowlers in the Test format of the game.

8. Satwik-Chirag win French Open doubles title

- ◆ The pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty clinched its second French Open men's doubles badminton title.

10. Rachin Ravindra becomes youngest cricketer to win Sir Richard Hadlee Medal

- ♦ New Zealand's top order batter Rachin Ravindra has become the youngest recipient of the Sir Richard Hadlee Medal after being named the country's outstanding male cricketer of the year.
- ♦ Meanwhile, Amelia Kerr became the year's top female cricketer after winning the Debbie Hockley medal for the second time in a row.
- ♦ Kane Williamson received the ANZ Test Player of the Year Award and won the Redpath Cup for men's first-class batting.
- ♦ Ravindra, 24, is the youngest winner of the award in its history, following a season in which he has established himself as a key member of New Zealand's red and white teams.

11. Max Verstappen triumphs at Saudi Arabian Grand Prix

- ♦ Red Bull's Max Verstappen clinched victory at the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix, starting from pole position.
- ♦ It marked Red Bull's second consecutive one-two finish in the 2024 Formula One season.
- ♦ It was the first time Verstappen, winner of a record 19 of 22 races last year, has won the first two races of a season.
- ♦ Sergio Perez (Red Bull) finished at second and Charles Leclerc finished third for Ferrari.
- ♦ The victory was a ninth in a row for Verstappen, dating back to Japan last September, and the 56th of the 26-year-old Dutch driver's career.
- ♦ It was also his 100th career podium while Red Bull's 115th win lifted them ahead of Williams in fourth place on the all-time list.

12. Mumbai Wins Ranji Trophy 2024 after beating Vidarbha

- ♦ Mumbai has won the Ranji Trophy 2024 after beating Vidarbha by 169 runs at the Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai.
- ♦ It also happened to be their 42nd title for Mumbai, which showed why they are deemed as a brute force in Indian domestic cricket.
- ♦ Mumbai also ended their 8-year-long wait to win the championship after they last got their hands on the title back in the 2015-16 edition.
